Introduction

The final report offers a comprehensive overview of the URPP's key objectives, activities, and achievements. It outlines the potential of the URPP to create lasting structures and to strengthen UZH's positioning in the field of research. Furthermore, the report highlights significant outcomes of the URPP regarding its impacts on the given research area, the promotion of early-career researchers, and society.

Formal guidelines:

For the structure of the final report the provided **template** must be used. The use of graphs, diagrams, and pictures is encouraged. Please include a table of contents and add page numbers. All abbreviations must be explained. The report must be written in English, Arial, font size 10pt, line spacing 1.15. The maximum length is 29 pages (excluding title page, table of contents, and appendix). The report must be submitted as a single PDF document **by January 17, 2025** to the Division of Research Development (sandra.volken@uzh.ch).

Content:

Title Page and table of contents

The title page can be freely designed but contains the following information: "Final Report University Research Priority Program (URPP)", funding period, URPP title, leading house faculty(ies), date and name and signature of director(s). Please include a table of contents following the title page.
